FINE ART GCSE

(AQA 8202)

Percentage in examinations / coursework:

The GCSE in Art is a two-year course with 60% of the marks going to **coursework** and 40% for the final examination.

Exam structure:

The Coursework, (Component 1) is called the PORTFOLIO, and consists of:

One Sustained Project, a creative journey from initial idea to final outcome plus
A Selection of Further Work undertaken during the student's course of study.

This work is marked as a whole and needs to satisfy AQA's four assessment objectives which broadly cover the following: drawing from observation, developing ideas, experimenting with different media, making critical judgements, analysing the work of other artists, and bringing work to a conclusion.

These criteria are assessed on quality and quantity. The Art Department aims to meet these objectives at the same time as encouraging an individual and creative response in all pupils. Art at this level can be a rewarding and creative activity that complements other subjects in the curriculum as well as adding to and balancing the list of qualifications for further study.

The Exam (Component 2) is called the EXTERNALLY SET ASSIGNMENT and consists of a choice of questions set by AQA, given out from the 1st January to allow a sketchbook of preparatory work in answer to one chosen question. The preparatory work must meet the assessment criteria. The exam is spread over ten hours, usually on two or three sessions/days in May. The preparation and the ten-hour examination are marked as a whole. Although skill is rewarded and some pupils have more natural talent than others in Art, there is still room to enjoy and be creative whatever the level of ability as well as getting good results.

Percentage in examinations: 100%

Exam structure:

- J282/01 Language - 1 hour 30mn 50% of the grade

This paper consists of a linked set of Latin Passages for translation and comprehension.

- J282/03 Prose Literature - 1 hour 25% of the grade

This paper consists of questions on a prepared prose text. Students will answer comprehension, critical, and translation questions.

- J282/05 Verse Literature - 1 hour 25% of the grade

This paper consists of questions on a prepared verse text. Students will answer comprehension, critical, and translation questions.

Course summary:

The course covers Latin's Language and Literature. The language paper requires knowledge of grammar and an ability to approach every clause correctly. Grammar and approach are therefore our primary focus.

The literature papers include a book of Virgil's great Aeneid and a selection of prose texts, typically from Caesar or Tacitus. We read, translate, and learn how to analyse the text in preparation for the literary criticism questions that will be asked.

Topics taught:

How to translate a sentence from Latin to English and vice versa; how to comment intelligently and intuitively on ancient texts and to enjoy reading them and the cultures they reflect.

Skills taught:

Important skills the students will acquire are the ability to give a close reading of a text and to pick up on linguistic details. This will stand any pupil in good stead for a career, let's say, in Law or Medicine. They will also learn how to enjoy and reap the rewards of literature that may, at first glance, seem too esoteric and require too much work.
