

Health plan (PAI): Information to families

Dear parents,

From the 1st day of the school year, pupils with a chronic medical condition (asthma, allergy, epilepsy, diabetes 6) requiring special treatment or care should make themselves known **to the school secretary** (contact.malraux@lyceefrancais.org.uk).

Depending on the case, and following a request from the parents, the secretariat will draw up a list of these pupils in order to organise an appointment with the school doctor, Dr Momeni, who will decide whether or not to set up an Individualised Health Plan (PAI). This also applies to pupils for whom a PAI is already in place at the school and who have to renew it each year but have not done so by June.

Pending an appointment with the school doctor, you must provide the school secretary with the following in person on the first day of school:

- A small emergency kit with the child's name on it and a photo, taking care to check the expiry dates of medicines;
- A medical certificate valid for less than two years: dated and signed by the practitioner, with a description of the illness/allergy and the symptoms;
- Updated medical prescription: with name of medication, dosage and method of administration;
- Allergy test less than 2 years old, for all food allergies: nuts, eggs, soya, gluten, lactose, etc. (This test is not necessary if the child has an Asthma PAI);
- Parental authorisation to administer the products, dated and signed (on request from the secretariat);
- 3 photos
