6ÈME

- LV1 English = 4h
- LV1 b = 3h
 German or Spanish
 or Italian or Russian

5ÈME

- LV1 English = 4h
- LV1 b = 3h
 German or Spanish
 or Italian or Russian

4ÈME

- Same compulsory languages
- Optional addition of Latin or Greek or LV1b complement or LV3 (Spanish, German or Arabic)
- Option to continue to the British Section after 4^{ème}






THE PLURILINGUE SECTION

3ÈME

- LV1 English = 4h
- LV1 b = 3h
 German or Spanish
 or Italian or Russian
- Optional: Latin or Greek or LV 1b complement or LV3

WHO IS THE INTERNATIONAL SECTION FOR?

- Fluent/bilingual students
- Students with a real love of English <u>Literature</u>
- Students who are ready for the challenge of extra hours / subjects
- NOT for students who are looking to improve their spoken / written English.







THE INTERNATIONAL SECTION

6ÈME

- LV English language and literature = 6h + 1h support
- History & Geography in English (DNL) = 2h (+2h in French)

5ÈME

- Same English schedule (except support) and DNL
- LV2 = 3h German or Spanish

4ÈME

- Same language schedule
- Optional addition of **Latin** or **Greek** (2h)





THE INTERNATIONAL SECTION

3ÈME

Same language schedule

EXAM

- Same English schedule (except support) and DNL
- DNB-I (DNB + two oral tests in English language and History in English)

ENTRY INTO 6èME

INTERNATIONAL SECTION

Entry to the International Section is decided via a test. Last year due to Covid, assessments were conducted virtually. It is likely such testing will be in place for September 2021 applicants. Methods of assessment are in discussion and will be communicated shortly.

PLURILINGUE SECTION

Testing is used to determine into which level English group pupils will be placed. Once again, methods of assessment are in discussion and will be communicated shortly.







PASSERELLE / BRIDGE 3^{èME} / 2^{NDE}

- Students from SP can apply to enter the SI: they can do the IGCSE in English Language. Some may also take the IGCSE in English Literature depending on their ability to catch up on the 3^{ème} SI programme.
- Students can elect to leave the International Section at the end of $3^{\text{ème}}$.








THE LYCÉE

THE SECONDE GÉNÉRALE

- Option to attend OIB (option internationale du baccalauréat, on demand for pupils coming from the International Section; by examination for other pupils).
- Same language choices as in *collège* (please note all languages are subject to continuous learning: no beginners in *seconde* class).
- IGCSE Language / Literature These are compulsory for most International Section pupils (except for those who joined SI in 3ème who may only take the English Language IGCSE) and comprise 4 written exams and 1 oral exam in May of 2^{nde}. It is a 2-year course and students start to prepare in 3ème.







THE LYCÉE

FROM PREMIÈRE

- Reform of the Baccalaureate
- Optional bridge from seconde générale to the British Section (A levels), conditional (minimum grade B at English language IGCSE + test)
- OIB English and H/G: part of the « tronc commun » of subjects but with a higher coefficient (worth almost as much as the « spécialité » subjects)
