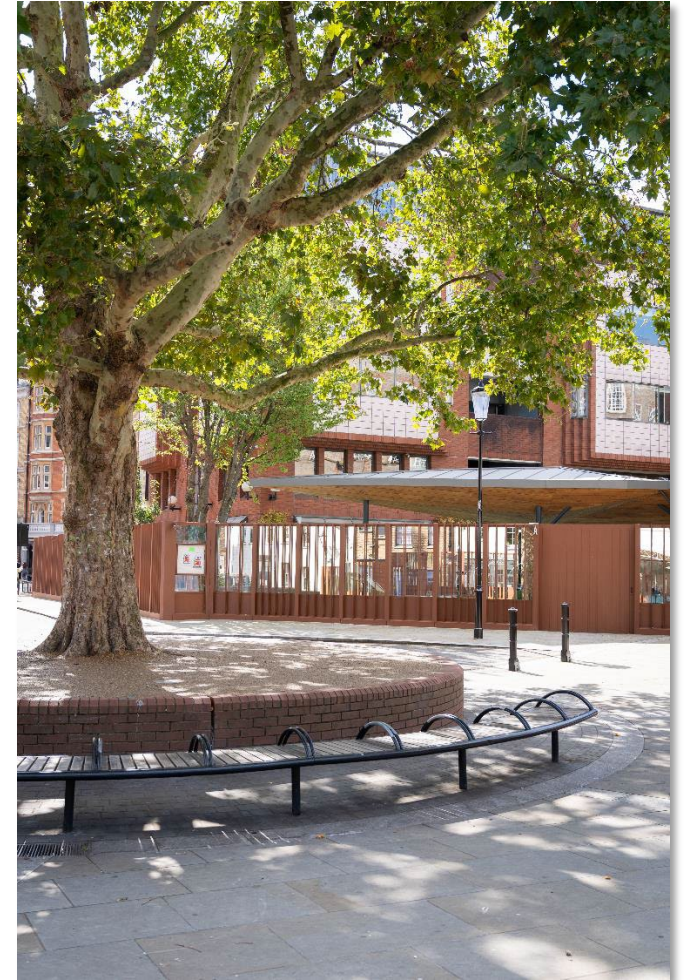

## WHO IS THE INTERNATIONAL SECTION FOR?

- Fluent / bilingual students
- Students with a real love of English Literature
- Students who are ready for the challenge of extra hours / subjects
- NOT for students who are looking to improve their spoken / written English.



# THE INTERNATIONAL SECTION

## 6ÈME

- **LV English language and literature** = 6h + 1h support
- **History & Geography in English** (DNL) = 2h (+2h in French)

## 5ÈME

- Same English schedule (except support) and DNL
- **LV2** = 3h German or Spanish

## 4ÈME

- Same language schedule
- Optional addition of **Latin** or **Greek** (2h)
- Option (test-based) to move to the **British Section** after 4ème

# THE INTERNATIONAL SECTION

## 3ÈME

Same language schedule

Start of the 2-year IGCSE English literature and language programme

## EXAM

- Same English schedule (except support) and DNL
- **DNB-I** (DNB + two oral tests in English language and History in English)

## ENTRY INTO 6<sup>ÈME</sup>

### INTERNATIONAL SECTION

Entry to the International Section is determined via a test.

### PLURILINGUE SECTION

Plurilingue classes are ability-streamed for English. For pupils already in one of the Lycée's primary schools or partner schools, English teachers provide the Lycée with a recommended level for each pupil. External pupils will be assessed in September.





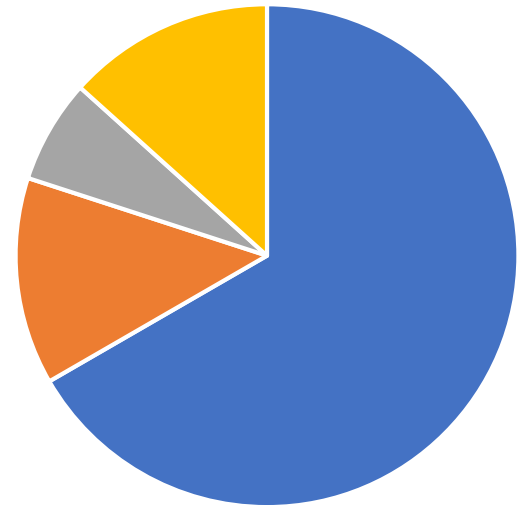
## EXAMINATION PROCEDURES FOR ENTRY TO THE INTERNATIONAL SECTION

- London-based pupils will come to our South Kensington site on Saturday 26<sup>th</sup> April for a test.
- Pupils living abroad will sit the test at their school during the week beginning Monday 28<sup>th</sup> April.
- We will use an 11+ test from the external company GL Assessment.
- The test is a written, paper-based test. Pupils will read two short texts (each text is roughly one A4 printed side in length) and then will answer about 60 multiple-choice questions.
- The questions are designed to test pupils on their reading comprehension skills, vocabulary, punctuation, spelling and grammar.
- The tests are of an advanced/fluent level, so please bear this in mind when submitting an application

## **PASSERELLE / BRIDGE 3<sup>ÈME</sup> / 2<sup>NDE</sup>**

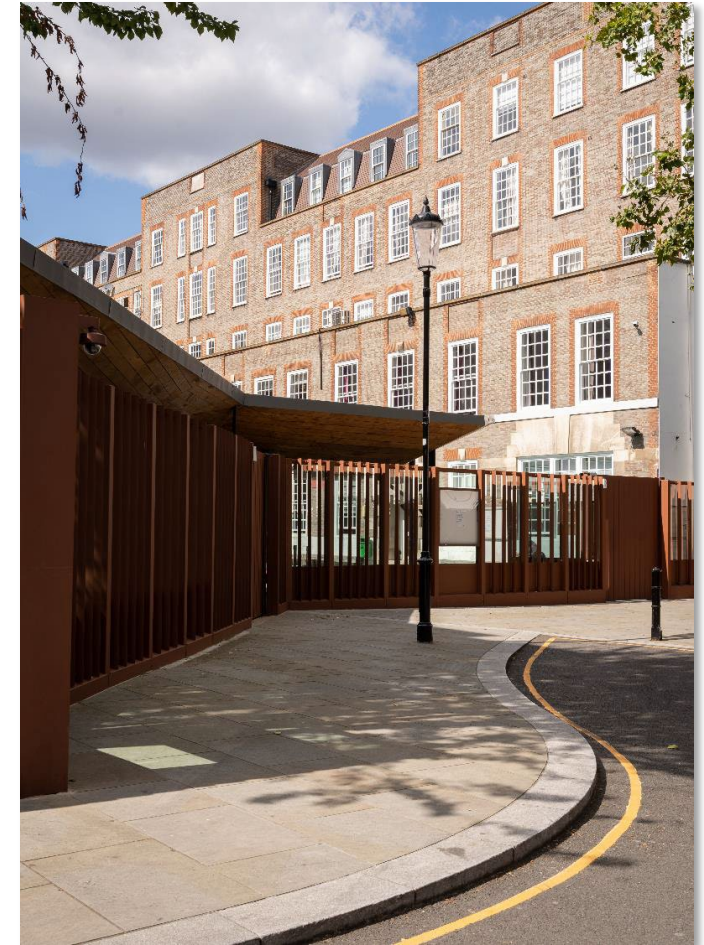
- Students from SP can apply to enter the SI: they can do the IGCSE in English Language.

- Students from 2nde SP can apply to enter the B.F.I (test based)
- A'levels (British Section)
- Optional bridge from seconde générale to the British Section (A levels), conditional (minimum grade B at English language IGCSE + test)
